ELSECAR SKELTER

- DATE: Saturday, 1st August 2015.
- VENUE: Market Inn, Elsecar, Barnsley (follow Heritage Centre signs)
- OBJECT: To complete a 27, 21 or 15 mile circuit on foot, mainly on footpaths and tracks, visiting a series of checkpoints and following a route description - within a 10 hour time limit. *A decision on whether to complete the 15 mile route can be made at checkpoint 3 (Westwood Country Park) and a decision on the 27 and 21 mile routes at checkpoint 4 (Cundy Cross).
- START: 8.30 a.m. Registration from 7.30 a.m.
- PARKING: Public Car Park adjacent to the start
- REFRESHMENTS: Food and drinks provided en route (Please carry your own mug). Pie and Peas at finish.
- EQUIPMENT: You are advised to wear suitable footwear and clothing. Please carry waterproofs, compass, whistle, survival bag and map.
- MAPS: 1/50000: Sheffield & Doncaster Sheet 111. Sheffield & Huddersfield – Sheet 110. 1/25000: Sheffield & Barnsley – Explorer 278.
- AWARDS: A badge and certificate will be presented to all entrants who complete the event.
- ENTRY: Age limit entrants under 16 yrs of age must be accompanied by either a parent or guardian Dogs are allowed if kept on a lead at all times

N.B.: - Due to limited space at the walk venue - entries are limited to 150

RULES

- You must obey the instructions of walk officials
- You must visit checkpoints in the correct order during their opening times
- You must make every effort to follow the prescribed route as laid out in the route description provided at the start of the walk
- You must respect and obey the Countryside Code
- Dogs are only allowed on the walk if they are kept on a lead and under control at all times
- Walk officials have the right to withdraw participants if their fitness to continue is in doubt
- Walk officials have the right to withdraw participants if they fail to reach a checkpoint before its scheduled closing time
- · Walk tallies must be endorsed by a walk official at each checkpoint
- Walk tallies must be passed to a walk official at the end of the walk or when retiring from the walk at a checkpoint
- If you have to retire from the event please do so only at a checkpoint, ensure that you inform a walk official of your retirement and hand in your walk tally
- <u>Please do not retire from the event without ensuring that the</u> walk officials are informed!
- In the event of early retirement from the event, transport will be arranged for your return to the finish
- All participants take part in this event at their own risk
- <u>The organisers of this event are not liable for accidents, thefts</u> or loss of or damage to property (including whilst left in the car park).
- The route description issued for the guidance of participants must be used in conjunction with a compass and the appropriate Ordnance Survey Map

Detailed route descriptions will be placed on our website around 4 weeks before the event.
