(iv)	Challenge Walk Co-Ordinator - Mike Hyland	
	<u>5th Sundon Saunter</u>:- Event is on BBN and LDWA websites, is in Strider. On SiEntries, ready to go live on the 1st September for LDWA members then for all from 20th October. <u>6th Hannington Hike</u>:- Flyer is done, and is on websites (BBN and LDWA), will go in August's Strider. On SiEntries in demo mode, ready to go live on the 1st December 2025 for LDWA members then for all from 2nd January 2026.	
(v)	Social Walks - Sara Waldron	
	Jim & I have been fielding emails from various sources. We have been keeping the Available Walks list and events up to date. As ever there are glitches in the website software which take up a disproportionate amount of time to fathom. We're still experiencing a patchy response for leaders to step up. It seems to be the same few people time and again. The interest in attending walks is variable – see Gill's list for more details. It will be interesting to discuss the figures. We've had a very good response to the Jurassic Way with plenty of help from Geoff, Graham & Jim in planning, leading & doing recces of the routes. Other members have led sections – Di, Steve C & Roy. We've had a good attendance at all the walks so far and the 2 upcoming ones are almost full. Booking the transport has been interesting but now that we're in the East of the walk I've got a really good company supplying minibuses. The North Beds Heritage Trail has already attracted interest & bookings. All the leaders have been identified and transport with Bill's Coaches has been booked. Looking to next Spring we have been thinking of putting on The Rutland Round. Geoff Curnock has done some route planning and there are suggested dates on the 2026 walks planner. I would like the committee's thoughts and agreement before taking this any further as there will be financial implications if we book transport again.	
	It was agreed that Sara should go ahead with planning a group walk of the Rutland Round. It is to the north of our area, but still in reach for a lot of members, 4 days of approx. 16 miles, with minibus transport. Sara said she would use Lawson's of Corby; they had proved efficient on the Jurassic Way and offered their services at a sensible price. The cost should be roughly £200. The contribution from participants could possibly be increased to £7.50.	Sara
	Group walks of local LDPs are proving very popular, with individual members also walking sections they have missed with the group.	
	Jim has ideas for group walks of LDPs in our area, which were discussed:	

	• The Chiltern Way. About 125 miles, as 8 linear walks. Possibly joint with Essex & Herts. Jim would look into car parking, transport etc. Dee recommended the Chiltern Way Extension. The North Chiltern Trail was also discussed, 42 miles, over 3 days or 2 days over a weekend. The North Chiltern Trail was the preferred option for 2026, possibly joint with E&H. Jim to progress.	Jim
	• Sections of the Ouse Valley Way the group has not walked recently – The route is known to be very overgrown before and near Buckingham.	
	• Inner Aylesbury Ring 32 miles. This could be two linear walks with car sharing or four circular walks. Jim to progress.	Jim

	Terry confirmed that Liz had supplied the GPX file for her walk, and Nick had sent what JW files he has. Gill will let Terry have a paper copy of the May Meanders walk. Terry said she is happy to have a paper copy of any route; she can then use OS maps to plot the route and then upload it to the Walks Database. Dee said walks leaders can always ask a participant with a GPX file to forward it to Terry.	Gill

	There was some discussion as to whether the incident on a recent group walk where a member had been knocked to the ground by a horse should have been, or should now be, reported. There had been no obvious injuries at the time, but later that day injuries had become apparent and, although the member had not sought medical treatment, problems were ongoing.. Sara confirmed she had reported the matter to the local Council. An officer had visited the site, had crossed the field with the horses with no problem, and had subsequently confirmed the matter was closed. It was agreed that Sarah would submit a retrospective incident report form to the LDWA, with input from Sara, and report back to the next meeting.	Sarah/ Sara

7.	BBN Challenge Events	
(i)	23rd Chiltern Kanter (2nd March 2025) Roy Carter	
	The 23rd Chiltern Kanter was held on Sunday 3rd March for 227 participants who had arrived. There were 237 expected on the Kanter, based on the bookings from SiEntries. It represents a 96% turn-out on the day and they all finished with only 4 retirements. On the Short route: 46 completed; the Medium route: 86 completed & Long route: 91 completed. Also, 24 participants had the honour of receiving the CK-HH-PM Triple Challenge. The weather was cool, dry and reasonably sunny, which participants thought	

were ideal. Quite a relief considering all the wet weather we had before the event which got us concerned about parking in the orchard at Pitstone Museum. There were 18 Marshals on hand to help with any eventuality that may have occurred on the day. At Pitstone we had a duty rota for the whole day and a kitchen roster for the washing-up and cleaning. Everyone was kept busy throughout the day and the only action was a supermarket visit because we'd run out of custard. We anticipated there could be difficulties at Wigginton in managing the throughput of participants since it was a "Multi-Checkpoint". It was Checkpoint 1 on the short route, Checkpoint 1 & 2 on the medium route and Checkpoint 1,2 & 3 on the long route. This was addressed by Beryl & Mike preparing the necessary paperwork before the event and doing an excellent job booking the participants in on the day, with Alan adding vital backup to keep the master sheet up to date. Early on Alan told people to have their tally cards ready on entry, so by the time they came through for a second or third time they had them in their hands as they entered the hall.
