Capital Challenge 2023 Report – 7th Capital Challenge

The Capital Challenge was very popular this year, with it being the first time we had physically run the Windmill Route. This year's event had a limit of 200 walkers and was fully booked by mid January (we opened for registrations on the 4th November 2022) and when I closed the list in February we had 20 people on the waiting list (with more added during the closed period and many more asking to be considered). We over enrolled 20 people at the beginning, which took into account expected drop outs and what we thought we could safely handle.

On the morning of the walk we expected 192 people; 20 did not start, leaving a total of 172. A further 7 people retired during the walk and 1 disqualification, leaving 164 people who officially completed the walk.

- Finish times ranged from 5 hours and 58 minutes to 10 hours and 34 minutes.
- Age of participants ranged from 18 to 79 years old
- All starters registered as UK residents.
- 30 out of the 162 due to start were not LDWA members
- 33 London LDWA members took part, with 23 other LDWA groups represented
- People travelled from far and wide, ranging from Wales, Devon & Cornwall, Dorset, Norfolk, Suffolk, Cumbria, Lancashire, Lincolnshire, Shropshire, Yorkshire and Merseyside
- As always our neighbouring LDWA groups were well represented, including Surrey, Kent, Thames Valley, Essex and Herts and Sussex

We were very lucky with the weather, with the rain showers passing through London just before we officially started the walk, leaving it slightly overcast for the morning, brightening up in the early afternoon and for those people still walking after 5.30pm we had some late showers.

Approximately 125 Hot X Buns, 70 Scones, 150 packs of mini cheddars, 400 sweets, 150 packs of crisps, 300 chocolate bars, 200 biscuits and 300 cakes were consumed throughout the day. Not to mention the hundreds of cups of tea, slightly less coffee and some squash along the way – all handed out by our brilliant Marshals.

The start was very busy at 07.30 with around 100 people eager to leave the checkpoint at 07.45, by 08.15 the majority of walkers had started with the final few through by 08.45.

A steady stream of walkers went through the 3 checkpoints, with many especially enjoying Brixton Windmill, before getting to the end (despite a few diversions).

With everyone accounted for the last checkpoint was closed and everyone headed home by 7pm.
