THREE COUNTIES WALK Sunday July 8th 1979

This is an informal walk suitable for both long-distance walkers and those who enjoy walks up to about 15 miles. With the assistance of a coach malkers can choose to cover the approximate distances of 14,22 or 33 miles. The malk is so named because it passes through parts of Miltshire, Derkshire, and Hampshire.

Hasically the walk will be from west to east with the main starting point being at Ludgershall, Wilts, and the finish just west of Basingstoke. See sketch map below for further details. A coach will leave Guildford, Surrey at 07.15, and pick up other walkers at Basingstoke railway station at 08.15 approx. Those tackling the longer walks will leave the coach at Ludgershall whilst the coach will take people doing the shortest distance to near Botley Down where they will start. There will be pick up points at Seven Harrows and near Basingstoke(18.00 approx.)

The walk passes along the highest chalk ridge in Britain and reaches its greatest elevation at Malbury Camp (975 feet). There are several other points over 900 feet and such of the way is over 800 feet. Other notable hills are Inkpen Beacon and Pilot Hill, and Watership Down has recent literary associations. The only village to be passed through is Hamnington(towards the end).

Walkers should bring sufficient food for midday and evening because there are few opportunities to obtain refreshment en route. The walk will be limited to 52 walkers(the number of coach seats) unless others can make their own arrangements to get to the start or unless there are enough walkers for more than one coach:

Ordnance Survey sheet 174(1:500000) covers most of the route but sheets 184 and 185 cover the first and last few miles. It is hoped that a route description will be issued.

The coach will start from Guildford railway station (07.15 sharp). If joining here allow time to park your car. A fare will be charged for all coach passengers. Intending travellers should send a deposit to Alan Blatchford to book a seat(f1 from Basingstoke and £2 from Guildford). Any balance will be collected on the day. Any queries: ring Guildford 60005. Hake payable to LDMA Surrey The accompanying form should be completed and sent with coach fare if coming. There is no walk fee.

This walk was first completed in Narch 1974 by members of the Surrey, and what is now the Messex Group.
