24 members attended the nesting at The Leg of Putton and Cauliflower on 6th Cetober. Once again the function room was taken by snother organization so we had to make do with the restaurant. Also we had to wait for diners to finish thereby causing the meeting to start late and some of the business to be rushed. The officers were asked to investigate the possibilities of finding alternative promises for our meetings.

On looking through the June report, occurent was made that the results for the Cumbrian Hundred had not yet been received. Chris Steer had written to Tony Cresswell but had not received a reply, however, the national committee were sware of the problem and are urging Tony to get the results, bedges and certificates out.

The treasurer was not present but he left a statement to the effect that the group has funds to the tune of £160. This does not include the profit from the Surrey Samits which should be in the region of £80 or the Guildford Boundary which will also show a large profit.

Tony Certwright suggested that the Surrey Group have their own Tee Shirts and running vests. The suggestion had been prompted mainly from other teams in the Mabas Pun Run League turning out in their 'team colours' but if we had printed running vests, the same design could be used for tee shirts. Very little time was available for discussion so I would be interested in comments from members on the idea in reedimess for the next meeting.

The suggestion was made that the group should have some "warning" notices to motorists to be used on events where the route goes over or slong a busy road. The suggestion will be considered.

It was decided to spend £40 on a general purpose checkeard for Surrey group events. Organizers please note these checkeards will be available shortly.

### THE ALAH BLATCHPORD MENORIAL PURD

Alan's many friends and aquaintances have donated over £3000 towards a memorial for him. Host of the money has been given to the Mational trust to be used for initial clearance on land, the trust has recently aquired a long term lesse. Pences are to be erected with an ample supply of stiles to allow both sheep grazing and public access. The land is part of the Evelyn estate along the scarp slope of the North Downs between Hackburst down and Ranmore. (North of the £25 Guildford - Dorking Road). 40 scree of this land is now known as "Blatchford Pown".

Many of Alan's family and close rriends attended the opening ceremony on 18th October, when the Metional Trust sign proclaiming the land to be "Blatchford Down" was unveiled. A series of walks to "Blatchford Down" are being planned for a mass picnic and a brief talk by a member of the Mational Trust on 23rd bey 1982. The route of the Pilgrims 100 plus event will also go through "Blatchford Down"

The Surrey Group have volunteered to clear a sunken path running through "Blatchford Down" and the 2 days chosen for this exercise are Sunday 1st November and Saturday 5th Docember. Details are given in the programme so please make an effort to attend one or both of these parties if you can.

The money densted in excess of £3000 will be used to provide glass fronted map cases for Tanners Hatch Youth Hostel.

#### PAST EVENTS AND WALKS

During the sussor we have had only one social walk. More were not planned because the number of events in the area and holidays may have meant social walks would be poorly strended. Some members have expressed a desire that there should be regular social walks throughout the susser even though the number taking part may be depleted. Perhaps this can be borne in mind when plenning the 1982 programms.

As fer as I know, only ? Surrey Group members went on the Lyke Wake Welk coach trip organized by the Essex/Ferts group. Both enjoyed themselves and thought the transportation to be well organized and the backup superb.

Our sole social walk. The Midsummer Evening Walk, at rected 24 members. Berbere Bletchford led us on an 8 mile plus route to the cast of Guildford to finish back at 11 Thorn Bank with the usual banquet meniting us.

On the Weybac Walk, 148 runners/walkers set off free Godslining to negotiate the various fishing rods along the 17 miles of the Wey Navigation towpath to the BMs sports ground at Weybridge. The pace was hot with a quarter of the field finishing in less than 4 hours and 25 of those finishing in less than 3 hours. Unfortunately the 100% record was not maintained because the first 2 retirements were recorded in the 5 year history of the walk.

The Tempers merethon once again lived up to it's reputation as being the most popular walk of it's kind in the country. Like the winter version many said how they appreciated the route going over the relatively little trocden eastern side of the A24. Also much appreciated was the route marking.

Merwyn Harvey tried to organise a coach trip for group members to go to the Derset Doddle but only one person showed any interest so the project had to be shandoned. Several Surrey Group members did make their own way down to the walk and enjoyed 35 miles in blistering hot sunshine on a surprisingly tough coastal course. Vince Smith sgain defied the netsorologists to provide a fair day (with only slight drizzle at times) for his twelfth Chiltern merathen. There were 438 who took part in this 25 mile meander in the Chilterns of which 406 finished inside and 14 cutside the 9 hour time limit. The LDWA was the winning team for the second year running.

The Guildford Boundary Palk was 'back home' at the normal wenue of Henley Port this year. The preceding night was very wet and windy but this did not produce the floods to the 1980 standard. The route was changed to swoid going over the busy six laned new A3 and many commented favourably on this change as being a scenic as well as a safety improvement. There were 292 starters of which 280 finished in times ranging from 2 hours 48 mins to 9 hours 26 mins.

#### SCOIAL HVENIMOS

Our new policy to devote a whole evening to a slide show (rather than trying to cram one in at the end of a planning meeting) proved very successful. We had 2 shows which were both well attended and those who came were reserved with very entertaining evenings.

In July, Ann Sayer came to Chobbass to show us photos taken on her 837 mile record breaking walk from Lands End to John o'Greats. A number of people confessed they felt worn out just watching Ann exerting all that energy but declared they enjoyed the show. There were also many spurceiative comments on the refreshments provided by Boy Sarnsley

In September, Meel Vincent visited Ashteed with slides illustrating how 2 dereliet cottages were converted into the Tanners Hatch Youth Hostel we know and love. The operation was carried out by voluntary labour during wertime when materials were scarce and the improvisations made were quite educational. I'm sure we will view Tanners with renewed interest as we pass by an our welks after listening to Hoel and probably Surrey Durmits times will suffer as a result of this. Heel intends forming an association to ensure the preservation of the youth hostel "The friends of Tanners Hatch? I would also like to see the Surrey group members using their local expertise to help man some of the Surrey checkpoints. If you are willing to help, please let me know.


I know this is asking a lot, coming as it does so soon after the Surrey Survits, but I'm sure Surrey Group members will respond in their usual generous manner to help make both events successful

## How to get to Blatchford Down

Humbers following the event etc refer to the 03 1:50000 map covering the route or location.

- SURDAY 1st New 1981; BLATCHFORD DOWN PATH CLEARANCE. (187) see also sketch map. All furrey Group members who can make it are naked to help clear the sunken bridlewey going diagonally moress Blatchford Down contrains on GR 103487. Main party will neet 9.45.a.m. at Junction a25/82126 in Abinger Hammer GR 096474 (limited our parking evallable here). Tools will be provided but assistance will be needed to carry them to the operational site. There will be planty of tea but planes bring your own food. Those who cannot make it by 9.45 are welcome to some slong later but as parking is limited in Abinger Hammer it may be better to use the white downs road car park. GR 115493. Finish about 3.30.pm.
