PLANNING MEETING SEPTEMBER 14

21 members attended. The Prince of Wales in Shore offered good facilities for our meeting. The location meant that some people travelled further than usual, others less. In a large county like Surrey it is difficult to find a location that is convenient for everybody.

The meeting mainly concentrated on discussing the programme and this appears later in the Newsletter.

Chris Steer, Tony Cartwright and Jeff Ellingham expressed concern that the previous meeting had removed the Winters Tanners from the programme for 1990 and that in future years it would alternate with the Punchbowl Marathon. They felt that major decisions like this should not be made at programme planning meetings where the views of the whole group would not be represented. They did not think that some of the arguments for this alteration were valid. They specifically argued that the events used different helpers and that both events were essential to the national LDA calendar.

The Committee and other members of the meeting tried to answer these points. There are problems with helpers in view of the fact that the group runs at least 7 events over the year and there are not enough new helpers coming forward; the group would like to vary events and introduce new events but this cannot be done without changes to the existing programme. The Group does not have a Constitution and decisions have often been made at programme planning meetings in the past.

A vote was taken on whether the decision of the previous meeting should be overturned. By a narrow majority of 6 to 5 with 10 abstentions it was decided to retain the decision of the previous meeting. However it was agreed that the subject should be discussed again at the AGM.

Annual Dinner

This will be held at The Hurtwood Inn Peaslake at 8pm on Saturday December 16 after the Hurtwood Hedonic Hike (see programme). Any member wishing to attend must book with the Secretary by November 24 using the booking form below. Numbers are restricted to 30 and bookings will be taken on a first come first served basis. Members may bring wives, husbands etc. There is a choice of menu (but you must choose when making your booking(s)) and the price of each meal is either £12 or £13.50 depending on your choice of main course. This price does not include wine/drinks. These may be ordered at the bar between 7.30 and 8. The car will be down well before this for members who have completed the Hedonic Hike (which will finish about 8pm). In the past the hotel has made rooms available for members to change in, but they are not prepared to guarantee these this year. I shall be attempting last minute negotiations on this point. If you prefer drinking to driving you may like to stay the night at the hotel. The Secretary would welcome other topics/motions for discussion. Please let him have these before the meeting so that he can ensure they get a fair amount of time for discussion.
