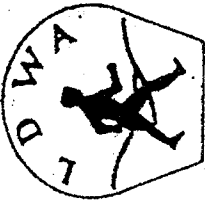

REPORT CONTINUED:

the heights of Marley Common, and sent Sherpa Valerie Challenger off on foot with a container of soup to open up Checkpoint One; whilst they investigated other possible approach routes. Later on, the returning descents proved even more difficult.

The problem was reversed at Checkpoint Two where a steep descent had to be tackled to reach Hindhead Youth Hostel. Cars were abandoned $\frac{1}{2}$ mile away, and a sledge purchased from Ray Jolly that morning, was commandeered to transport the Soup etc.

Bob Bell thought he had it made, because his route from Milford to Checkpoint Three was dead flat. The outward journey was as slow procession along snow covered roads getting deeper as the strong cross-winds caused a 2 foot drift between two fields. A snow-plough was to come to their rescue though before the Scouts had a chance to earn a badge for Igloo making.

The snow also caused problems with the reading of the Route Description as identifying tracks of any kind in open country proved difficult. One such area was Blackdown, where after a much higher success rate of finding the Trig. point was achieved this year, the open area & the slippery slopes caused problems, to those not using their compasses. Dan Hadfield was once again the first Walker home on the 30 in 5hrs 5mins (44 mins slower than last year).

I hope you all enjoyed your day out; and if you have any suggestions as to how the Route Description or the Event as a whole could be improved, please drop me a line.

The Punchbowl Marathon date was switched to early Feb. some years ago to create a more balanced LDWA Calendar. Even Summer walking can sometimes present a stern challenge in terms of mental fitness, equipment & knowledge of the basic principles of survival; and which Eventers must always be prepared for. Last Sunday was certainly a day that tested these three requirements.

Strong icy winds whipped the plains & hilltops, & the thick snow often gave way to ice & slush. The real heroes were the Checkpoint Marshalls, strongly followed by those who were determined to complete the 30 miler & braved Kettlebury Ridge. Those who decided to switch their entry to the 20 miler will still have enjoyed a stern challenge without the pressure of having to 'Beat the Clock'.

My phone had not stopped ringing on the Saturday, and my answer always had to be that if Entrants could get to the Start, then the road conditions should be good enough for us to man Checkpoints at or near their designated positions; & the Event would be on. 440 entries had been received from all over the South & Midlands; & up to 200 entries could be expected on the day if the conditions dramatically improved. It was impossible to contact all those possible 600 entries at 24 hours notice, so it had to be left up to the individuals decision on the Sunday morning. If more than 10 made it to the Start, & I felt that the local roads were safe enough for me to use, then I would have supported those 10. The LDWA Calendar & my own could not accommodate a re-arranged date. Those currently fit enough, & who enjoy Winter conditions, would try to get to Witley; others would be more than happy to climb back into bed.

There were those who did not have such an easy decision to make. No one enjoys standing out in freezing conditions for hours on end, so the Checkpoint Marshalls had to have a strong sense of purpose & allegiance to LDWA ideals to venture out that morning. To all of them I, & am sure you as well, are most grateful. After all the worry of whether I had made the right decision not to cancel the Event, it was very reassuring to be joined at the Hall by John Westcott at 6am, with the news that he had had a clear run. Then with renewed confidence of a good turnout I set up the Hall whilst John tackled the soup-making operation. In the circumstances the 264 who started out between 8 & 9 was impressive.

Ray Jolly was soon selling Compasses etc. to Walkers & the local Police!; then the first wave of Walkers were away. At 9.45am John & Mervyn gave up their initial attempts at selling
