Checkpoint Timings

This year we introduced recommended start times to try and ensure that we didn't have so many issues with people arriving at checkpoints early, or late. This seems to have worked reasonably well with e.g. only 3 walkers arriving at CP1 10 minutes outside of it's scheduled opening times. This makes things easier for those marshals heading on to other checkpoints/duties, and helps us keep track of everyone, so thanks to all for keeping to the planned timings.

The Weather

There had been a long relatively dry run-up to the event, so those hoping for Winter Tanners style mud would have been a bit disappointed ! There was also a lack of the winter storms that preceded, and in the end resulted in the cancellation of the 2019 event. There was a little bit of damp in the air, but conditions were generally good and not too cold for February.

The Route

The 20-mile route was unchanged from last year. The 30-mile route however was altered somewhat, and Checkpoint 3 moved from Puttenham to Seale.

Entries and Starters

As usual, the event filled up well before the closing date. To try and encourage as many to start as possible, we allowed refunds for people withdrawing up to a week before the event, with entries automatically re-opening to ensure there were 350 entered. In the end 274 started which was a good improvement on 2022 when a dire weather forecast may have put a few people off, but still over a 20% drop-out rate, and a bit below our expected 300 starters. There were a few swaps between routes, and in the end we had 158 on the 30-mile route and 116 on the 20-mile route.

Last year, exceptionally, there were no retirements. This year 8 dropped out, so our retirements driver at least had some retirees to pick up.

The spread of times on the 20 mile route was between 3:05 and 8:24. On the 30 mile route the spread was 4:37 to 11:10.

<u>CP3 – Seale</u>

Avoiding the need to cross the A3, the route then heads Northwards through Thursley and Thursley Common to Elstead where the route splits. The 20 mile route (20.6 miles) then heads back to Tilford, whilst those on the 30 mile route head via Puttenham Common and the North Downs Way to CP3 at Seale (24.4 miles).
