

**REPORT** 126 people took part this year with 76 starting the 13 mile route and 50 the 19 miler - although there were a few sceptics asserting that the courses were longer than this as 'They couldn't have taken that long to do that distance'! I'm afraid searching for clues, even my easy ones, does take more time than you expect. Mark Pickard and William Brown each had it very much their own way as the fast boys on the respective routes and they found all the clues too! They got back early, but the last group arrived back at my home after 6pm after I'd closed up, having walked back through the middle of Guildford. Special congratulations to the Reader family led home by their 5 year old, still happy and chirpy.

One clue I did get wrong. The large name on Henry Morton Stanley's obelisk of a tombstone in Pirbright churchyard was not where he died. 'Bula Matari' was his Congolese nickname - 'Stone breaker'. He in fact died in London just off Whitehall! One clue to which I received many different answers was the 'number of wires in the fence by Henley Fort. I asked for this to encourage walkers to go through the little wood to the North of the track. I think 10 was the most logical answer (4 double wires and 2 single)

The only clue which appeared to cause real difficulty to many was the phone number on the path leading down to the North Downs Way. It was on an electricity substation, just before the NDW was reached.

Again entrants seemed to enjoy the challenge of the routes, which is the point of it so far as I'm concerned, but it could have been enjoyed even more by eating cakes at the cafe by Watts Gallery. I told the lady there that I was sending a 100+ people past her so she should get some customers but the urge to eat my soup was obviously greater than the lure of the cakes!

Can I thank very much helpers on the day - Peter Groundsell and Molly Warham, who did both morning and afternoon; Gillian Bull who did the morning before having to go off; Brian Haigh, who gallantly did only the short course so he could help in the afternoon; and my daughter Sally Greberg Chesterton (assisted by her husband) who on her visit from Sweden helped me in the kitchen! Thanks also to St Catherines Village Hall Committee for use of such good facilities, and to Barratt's who yet again allowed us use of their carpark for overflow parking and saved hassle for local residents.

But, above all thanks to you the participants, whose enjoyment makes it all worthwhile. Sally commented how cheerful and polite she found everyone - and nobody grumbled (like she said they do on other activities she helps to organise). Perhaps she was lucky, but I don't think so. I always find it that way at LDWA events. Let's keep it that way!
