At the post mortem meeting the committee asked me to convey their thanks to all marshals for their time and devotion and also to congratulate them on the very high standard of marshalling attained on this event.

## THE EIGHTH SURREY SUMMITS

When compiling the 1982 Surrey Summits results I reported that the early 10 a.m. start and the reversing of the route probably contributed to the high percentage of finishers. The 1983 event however, with the same arrangements tends to disprove this theory with the second highest percentage of retirements of all Surrey Summits and no apparent reason for this. True it was a little muddy underfoot but this in by no means unusual for this time of year and although it rained quite hard during the night, most people who retired did so before the rain started.

After giving a brief resumé of the gastronomic delights available at the manned checkpoints and an all too accurate weather forecast, Chris Stear started the walkers in motion. There were a record number of starters and it was nice to see the sedate manner in which they crossed the recreation ground in contrast to the mad dash at some LDWA events. I must say however that when I next saw the walkers at Holmsbury Hill, most had lost that bloom of freshness.

The afternoon proved to be pleasant enough tending to be a little overcast but mild and good walking progress was made. Come the evening steps started to falter, many in the direction of retirement, with most of the retirements coming in the Ramore to Henley Fort area. This is quite usual but in my instructions to marshals I did make the statement (based on previous events) that they need not expect more than 1 or 2 retirements once walkers had passed Henley Fort. There were in fact 12 which illustrates the organizers difficulties in predicting marshalling requirements even on an established event.

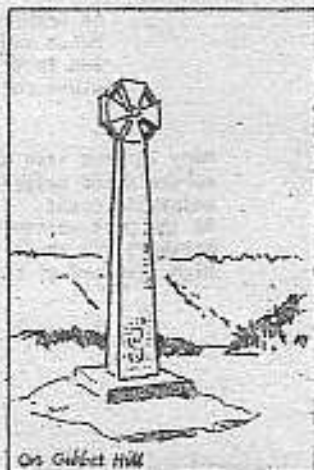
There were quite a few who had difficulty with the route description just before Hindhead Youth Hostel, finding themselves wandering all over the Punchbowl. I can only say that a great deal of time and thought went into the route description both in its content and presentation for easy reading. One feature is to cut out unnecessary wordage but although when I checked the offending sentence the instruction seemed logical to me, the fact that so many went wrong at the same point seems a fair indication that it is misleading. I did have to smile though when one of the walkers said "the route description told us to descend but the path went up and up". If this basic instruction is to be ignored, it does not really give the poor old route description author much of a chance.

In spite of the difficulties the first four home set up a new record in beating 15 hours by 2 minutes. The familiar names of Alan Ireland and Martyn Greaves were among the 4 but rumours has it that it was Tessa (Jim Guy's dog) that lead the way to hte finish. Richard Brown tells me that it was Jeff Ellingham's footsteps behind them that spurred them on to greater efforts in the latter stages but as Jeff retired at Guildford I wonder who the phantom walker is who Turks on Hankley Common at dead of night.

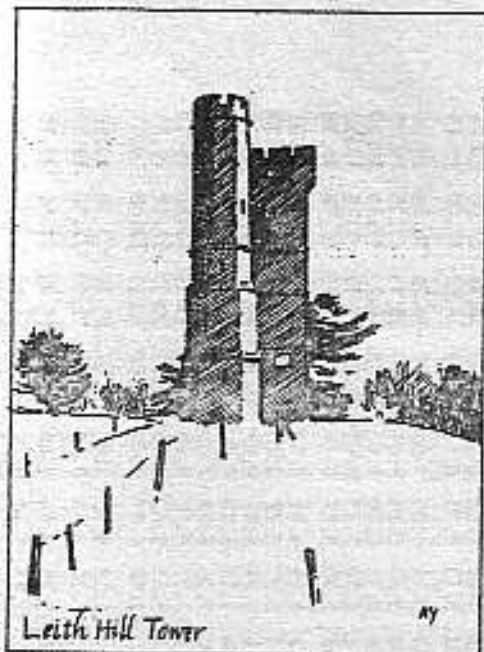

retire at Hindhead giving Roger the chance to beat the time limit at Witley by half an hour. There was no such sorrow in the mind of Carole Walters who positively gloated at her success having left her partner as a failure at Henley Fort. Its a good job Ron has got an amiable nature.

There was a suggestion that the battle for the Leith Trophy would be dominated by 2 teams headed by LDMA national committee members. On the day however, Tony Rowley's team disintegrated somewhat leaving the way fairly clear for Roger Michell and his friends from the Cantium Race Walking Club to take the trophy. This team of 4 Centurions (the slowest personal best over 100 miles is 21 hours 13 minutes) included 2 who were not used to cross country walking and found the going very tough. From what I hear it was just as well there was no inspector from the society for the prevention of cruelty to long distance walkers present to adjudicate on some of the methods used to get one of the team through. Phil Hastings becomes the first person to get his name on the Leith Trophy for a second time having previously been in the winning Kent LDMA team in 1977 with Ernie Bishop and Chris Barton. Once again the Surrey residents failed to form even one team to compete for the Gibbet trophy.

There are now only 2 with a 100% record those being Bill Grace and Martyn Greaves who have completed all 8 Surrey Summits.
