


Perhaps it was ironical that the committee chose the thirteenth Surrey Summits to make such radical alterations to the traditional route. The idea had been muted for years, implementation being delayed for the necessary research to be made for which there never seemed time. However, like most progress (some still do not consider the changes to be progress), the time is somehow found when you are committed so decided to go ahead with the change and we would have to get it ready in time for the event. At the time we did not know to what extent we would be involved in route research. The storms which hit the south east of England in the early hours of 16th October 1987 left devastion in its wake and most footpaths in central and western Surrey blocked by fallen For the next few months paths were surveyed for damage and monitored for progress on clearance by Surrey Group members. This was coordinated by Jeff Ellingham with a view to finding alternative paths for those which could not be cleared in time and deploying our own volunteer path clearers to points of the route where they would have the most effect . Thanks to a lot of faith by Jeff, hard work by him and his helpers and co-operation from The National Trust, The Hurtwood Control, Surrey County Council and The Forestry Commission we managed to get most of the intended route cleared in time. It was a near thing because just the week before, I walked the path leading up to the North Downs Way junction and considered it necessitated a diversion but Jeff assured me all would be O.K. and sure enough the Forestry Commission cleared it just 3 days before the event.

the comfort of the walkers the idea was to avoid got a reputation for bad weather to an extent where many entrants thought they had got the wrong day when they saw the weather prospects were good. Assured by the presence of so many other walkers, they accepted the inevitability of a Surrey Summits without having to wear waterproofs all the time and got down to the business of kit check and preparing for the start.

We changed it to a staggered start this year (some said they had heard of staggered finishes) which proved to be quite successful. One person said they missed Chris Steer's speech but I think all preferred the relatively relaxed set off across the recreation field rather than the massed dash

in fear of having your ankles kicked. Apart from the comfort of the walkers the idea was to avoid the paths being "spread" by too many walkers using a path at the same time often walking several walkers wide and overtaking one another. I did fear there would be conjection and queues as walkers waited to start. In order to try to avoid this I "unofficially" set some off 10 minutes early but all went smoothly and at 10 o'clock it was difficult for me to believe 199 had started.

One undesirable effect of the staggered start was caused by just a few walkers. In spite of asking walkers to choose their start time to ensure they did not get to the first checkpoint before opening time, there were 22 who checked in at Blackheath before 12.15. It is difficult to set walkers off according to their speed so we do expect them to co-operate by honouring our request and it is unfair to the marshals at the checkpoint that they do not do so. All got through Blackheath for the first time but there were two walkers who decided they had had enough soon after and returned to hand in their checkcards.

Having already walked quite a bit of the new route to get to Blackheath Village, the route then went through Blackheath, Farley Heath and the Winterfold switch-back before returning to the previous routes to go over Pitch and Holbury hills. It then took a diversion northwards to include the comfort of the checkpoint at Bulmer farm before resuming the eastward journey to Leith Hill. Soon walkers were reminded of what mud can be like on the Surrey Summits as they battled their way through Redlands wood and past Redlands Farm. This was a negotiated non "right of way" for the event but I hasten to add that the reason we used the track was not to satisfy the purists.

According to Ralph Henley, checkpoint 3 was the Milton Hilton and certainly it is amazing what a

little ingenuity can do to make a garage comfortable. The effect was completed when, for a while Ray Bardsley (the owner), acted as receptionist in his evening suit, frilled shirt and bow tie having dressed for a concert he was taking part in later that evening.

Most walkers went into the hours of darkness over the long section to Blackheath and as they did so the fine day, so ideal for walking, turned into an even finer night with just a wisp of moon which gave enough light to take the blackness out of the darkness, even in the wooded areas.

As usual, most who retired, did so either just before or just after it got dark but the numbers who went through the main checkpoint (this year at Blackheath) but subsequently retired, were a lot more this year. The reason could have been that the main checkpoint was earlier or the fine weather but more likely I would think it was due to the reviving qualities of Ken and Ricky Mayhew's stew. When I discussed the arrangements at Blackheath with Ken and Ricky a few weeks previously, we decided how the stew would be produced and I said I would confirm with the catering sub committee at our meeting a few days later. While at that meeting Ken 'phoned me to give me the benefit of some reaserch he had done. After telling me the ingredients and the costings he finished up by telling me "I know it makes a jolly good meal because we have had it for the last 2 evenings". Dedication to the cause indeed and how could we resist such a recommendation.

Some had a little difficulty in identifying the yellow arrow on tarmac pointing into the woods shortly after leaving checkpoint 4. I must admit my committee members did warn me there may be some difficulty. I spent a lot of time last July surveying those woods to find the best route through both to walk and describe. When I had



decided, I was pleased to find that yellow arrow pointing to the path and in the direction I wanted the route to go. Some months later, having forgotten the position of the arrow, I went back in the dark and had no difficulty finding it. Considering the warnings of other committee members, I felt the description could stand without mention of the arrow. Should I leave it in or take it out? On balance I decided to leave it as it was help rather than hindrance even if some did miss it. Unfortunately it seems to have become an obsession, many people thinking they had to find it before they went on. I can assure you it was there albiet a little faded by age.

After the detour to Blackheath, the North Downs Way was rejoined after the exhibarating climb to St Martha's Church. While on the North Downs Way the next checkpoint at Compton was visited. This being the only "outside" checkpoint, John Robinson

requested that he help to man it - he would not be done out of having his log fire. The shop at Puttenham being open through the night was appreciated by many even though it came shortly after checkpoint 5. I understand they again did a good trade in plasters.

We did not loose anybody on the steep descent from the new summit of Crocksbury Hill. Shortly afterwards walkers enjoyed the delights and comfort of Tilford Village Hall. It was daylight by the time that the Tilford Checkpoint closed and I thought it would be a good idea to have an early morning stroll by walking the route back to Witley. While walking the Kettlebury Ridge I came across Dilip Verma and David Weatherill laying back in the morning sunshine with their shoes and socks off and settling down in a manner that suggested they were not going to walk much further. They were the last 2 survivers of 6 youngsters who had set out to complete the route having been sponsored to raise funds for the World Wildlife Fund and were disappointed that the best of them had only achieved 85 kilometres. Getting to checkpoint 7 by the quickest route, to arrange a recovery vehicle for the lads, meant that I did not do the whole of the route back to Witley.

Having gone round the lip of the Punchbowl to get to Gibbet Hill summit walkers then had to dive into the Punchbowl to get to the last of the checkpoints at Keepers Cottage. Thence on the last section of the route to Witley where our Sue Boyman was waiting to register finishers before they got down to the business of eating the breakfast.


There were 151 finishers and although, as a percentage, this is the 2nd highest success rate of the 12 events (not counting the first which was basically a led preview walk to invited walkers) I would still have expected more finishers bearing

in mind we probably had the best overall conditions to date. There was a much bigger representation by the ladies this year than ever before with 34 taking part, 23 of them finishing including 8 with their husbands.

Bill Grace and Martyn Greaves keep their 100% record of having completed all 13 Surrey Summits with Keith Hewitt and Tony Rowley maintaining their record of each having just missed one. Tony Rowley made the observation that none of these four will miss completing a Surrey Summits now. Tony himself put his entry in late so there would be speculation about his not appearing in the entrants list sent with the final details but owing to the details going out late he was included in the list and so his ploy was defeated.

It was hoped to quietly cut out the trophies because since we changed the rules for their award it has tended to be a non event. However Jill Green on behalf of the Wessex Group and Ian Ditchfield on behalf of the Downs and Weald Rambling Club had urged team members to take part this year with the intention of winning the Leith and Gibbet trophies respectively. On the basis of of the reults, Wessex with 17 finishers would have toppled the domination of the Leith trophy being won by Kent who had only 12 finishers whereas The Surrey Walking club with two husband/wife finishers as well as Marion Lord could dispense with Barry Guffogg and Roger Moss to have taken the Gibbet trophy. Whether it would have been the same if the trophies were actually being competed for must now remain speculation. I am sorry if anybody did enter on the understanding that the trophies were to be awarded but there was no reference to them in the entry details.

Another successful event and hopefully all who took part enjoyed it. Unfortunately it was marred when our judges decided to disqualify 3 people who



were blatently ignoring the "walking only" rule. We do make it plain that this is an event for walkers only and it is unfortunate that people still enter who are not prepared to accept this one basic rule. All 3 subsequently retired.

I hope to see you all (all the walkers that is), on the fourteenth Surrey Summits which will be taking place over the weekend of 8th and 9th April 1989. The route will basically be the same as this year but we will be missing out Chinthurst Hill and the first visit to Blackheath village to find distance to include Boxhill again.
