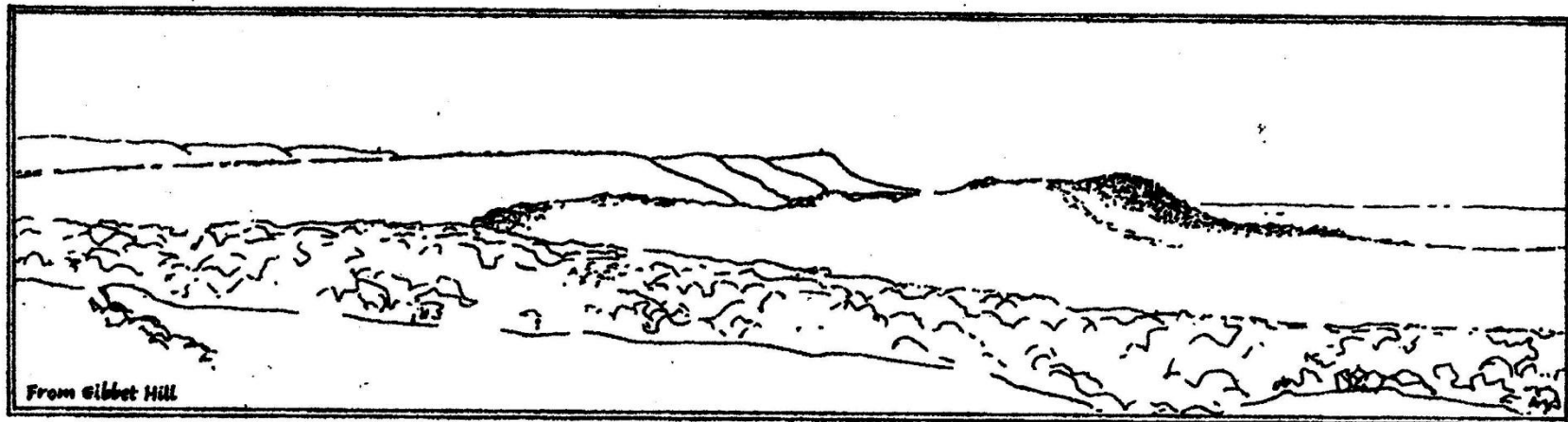

## REPORT ON THE FOURTEENTH SURREY SUMMITS

As I looked out of my office window the Wednesday morning before the event and saw the thick flakes of snow falling and settling on the Hogs Back I thought "what a pity we are not holding the event today, I am sure the walkers would enjoy the prospect of waiting at Witley for the off with weather like this to face them". The snow continued all day but overnight it turned to torrential rain and again my thoughts were with the would be walkers who would have been so pleased to have been navigating the Surrey hills in these conditions during the hours of darkness. Of course it could not last. By Thursday afternoon I was looking out of the office window on gentle rain and I remarked to one of my colleagues "if it goes on improving like this we will probably have bright sunshine by Saturday morning". Of course I was quite surprised when it turned out that way.

Of the 192 entries, 160 made the starting line setting off from Witley between 9.30 and 10.a.m. The official number of starters became one more during the event when a Surrey Summits committee member, who never entered, started walking the route in his capacity as checking for runners, with the declared intention of finishing probably at Blackheath, but went on to finish the route. The staggered start introduced in 1988 proved popular again this year and again went very smoothly.

The warm day and the long trek to the first checkpoint at Pitch Hill car park meant there were many thirsty walkers there and the marshals had to make some hurried arrangements to reinforce the supplies of water. By this time we had got one retirement. Tony Twyman on a last in first basis (he was the last to enter the event) suffered a sprain early on and decided to take a slow walk back to Witley. The Surrey Group events seem to have a jinx for him because he twisted his ankle on The Punchbowl.

After going over Pitch and Holmbury Hills then ascending to Leith Hill in the warm afternoon sunshine, the refreshments available at the summit tower proved very popular, many giving into the temptation not to wait for our official checkpoint at Milton Heath. After coming off Leith Hill there is a long track in the valley and at the turn off right, just before Broadmoor, the route description directed walkers to go past the drive and turn right on a narrow footpath but I understand most walkers shortcut by turning right on the drive.

Many walkers commented favourably on our including Box Hill again. Unfortunately we had to introduce a little main road walking around Dorking to do it. Some said they would like to see Mickleham Down back in but at present I understand the paths are still blocked from the October 1987 storms and I do not think walkers would appreciate too much clambering through trees. In any case it would be difficult to modify the route now to include Mickleham and Blackheath where the Cricket Club pavilion proves so popular as a checkpoint for the walkers and so convenient for the organisers.

We had negotiated with the National Trust to have a lean-to available for our checkpoint at Fox Cottage on Rannmore Common but unfortunately some unauthorised inhabitants had taken it over by parking their cars there. Fortunately we had a very experienced checkpoint official there in Ralph Henley and he managed to negotiate the use of a garage owned by a National Trust woodsman instead which proved very comfortable.

The long section to the Blackheath checkpoint is where darkness fell for most walkers which made the delights of chilli con carne and rice at that checkpoint all the more welcome. Some were a little concerned that the menu may have been a little spicy to take on in the middle of a walk but the cook was Janet Chapman (now a national LDWA committee member) who is a very experienced overnight herself so she made sure the recipe would be suitable for the occasion. With most

walkers it proved to be "just the ticket" and for that matter with the marshals too, I enjoyed 2 helpings even though the cook had said it was "past its best condition" by then.

The good conditions meant very few retirements, only 15 up to Blackheath, and normally there are very few who retire having got past the main checkpoint. However Patrick Duffy decided to retire shortly after and I think decided to have an evening at the theatre instead. When he got to Shalford he walked along the A281 to Shalford to go in the Yvonne Arnaud where, I understand, his appearance gave the impression to the staff that he was one of the actors rather than a patron. However, as the evening performance had started he explained his predicament and they allowed him to 'phone our emergency number for Ray Jolly to come and collect him.

The night was quite cool and the effect of this was very much felt in the big barn we had the use of for our Puttenham checkpoint. John Robinson usually has a bonfire in his open checkpoints so he fell victim to the chilly atmosphere and he had to stay there. At least the walkers could walk away. One of the retirements here was Mike Powell Davies, making his first appearance on the Surrey Summits since 1977. Instead of waiting for transport to arrive he thought it would be nice to walk back to Witley with his dog.

I had a number of appreciative comments on the modification of last years route to avoid the road walking just before Crooksbury Hill. At Tilford checkpoint walkers could linger a little longer in the relative warmth which was lacking at the previous checkpoint.

Over Hankley Common there were a few bangs, being evidence of the military on their night exercises, and although all our walkers got through, one or two thought it prudent to make sure their cover was secure as they walked along the Kettlebury Ridge. So on to the cosy comfort of Gnome Cottage in the Devils Punchbowl where it was quite easy to sit down in an arm chair and forget about the whole thing except that having got this far it would hardly be worth all that effort to give up now.

Those who were still walking at daybreak were treated to a beautiful sunrise giving way to a lovely morning but the vivid red which made the sunrise so spectacular was its own warning that the good weather was not going to last for long. It did stay fine long enough to let all the 135 finishers get back to Witley but by the middle of the afternoon the rain had started again. It was almost as though the organisers packed the good weather away with the gas urns, water containers and other equipment. I hope we can remember where we put it for next years event.

Flushed his success at taking the record for running from Lands End to John o' Groats last autumn, Richard Brown completed the route in the fastest official time ever, quite definitely walking though in accordance with the Surrey Summits rules. Incidentally Richard's end to end record has since been broken.

Bill Grace and Martyn Greaves completed the route to keep their 100% record although Bill I'm afraid again offended the judges eye with a doubtful action considered to contravene the "walking only" rule. Bill, I understand considers the action to satisfy the rule but more than one judge disagrees with him and so once again he has been credited with completing the event but his time has been eliminated. Keith Hewitt and Tony Rowley also completed the route to bring their tallies to 13 events each completed (just one short of the maximum).

I have had a number of appreciative letters including compliments on the selection of refreshment available, in fact I have had no written complaints about the food and drink at all. In fact I feel most of you are being polite because I know there were a number of walkers who expressed dissatisfaction at the level of food at the checkpoints and in fact

one or two of you have taken the trouble to ring me to point out the quality of refreshments was not as good as it has been in previous years but here the main criticism has been that the meal at the finish should have been more substantial. The committee are aware that refreshments at checkpoints and the finish was not as good as we would like it to have been. The reason for this I am afraid is money. The entry fee for the Surrey Summits has remained the same for many years and this has been possible because the generally steady growth in entries. Bearing in mind the "levelling off" tendency for 1988 but with a reasonable profit we thought we would still be able to absorb the increased costs for the 1989 event, which incidentally includes such items as an increase from £80 to £100 for the hire of Chichester Hall. Unfortunatley the number of entries dropped quite a bit reducing our income by about £250. At the time this was known we had already been committed to most of our expenses but the one area where we could cut down a bit was on our budget for food. We cut down on the selection and quality and we had to reduce our cost of either the meal at Blackheath or at Witley and on balance we thought walkers would like the availability of a substantial meal during the walk rather than at the end of it.

I do hope you did not think too badly of us for this policy and that we shall see you again on the 1990 event. The committee will be sitting shortly to re-budget the whole thing shortly so if you have any comments on the event, especially the refreshments, please let me have them.

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#### TRIPLE CHALLENGE

A suggestion has been made that a badge be available for those who complete the three 60 mile events organised by the LDWA south eastern groups - The Surrey Summits, The Wealden Waters and The Three Forests Way. He is seeking opinions of organisers and others connected with the events on such matters as title, how long the qualifying period should be and whether the scheme should be retrospective.
