	In attendance: Neil, Karen, Ian, David, Mike, Jane, Glyn, John and Andy
	Standing items: The club is committed to litter picking. Associated membership of the Ramblers and looking after the Trig point at Darwen.
1	Chairs Introduction. Minutes of the Last Meeting. Agreed. Update: The trig point at Darwen tower has been painted and our plaque polished by Neil, Sue and Peter.
2	Neil was keen to 'get ahead' and look at producing a walk's programme, from the 13th April, when the next reduction in restrictions was to take place. Whilst detailed guidance was not yet available it had been promised by the NEC of the LDWA before then and we could pre-empt this by having a programme ready to start no matter how limited. However, some members felt this was too soon. Discussion around a further ease of lockdown from the 17 th May, where numbers on walks could potentially increase (to up to 30) also met with some resistance, even though it was likely that numbers would still be at the discretion of the walk leader. There was no firm guidance yet from Sport England/LDWA in relation to safe numbers and distance walkers can travel, with current guidance being to exercise with one other and 'stay local'. Discussion took place around the numbers on walks and the level of risk being up to the individual. The issue of safety, ie using sanitisers after opening a gate and car parking were also discussed. It was agreed whilst everyone knew the concept of social distancing on walks, the reality is leading a walk with walkers could open 'a can of worms'. It was agreed to wait until there is firm guidance in relation to travel, risk assessments, walk numbers etc. Action – It was concluded that no group walking would take place until at least the 17 th May. However, a further Committee meeting would be held on the 26 th April at 6:30pm to consider the Guidance, which we would hopefully have by then, with a view to deciding if May 17 th was the right time to begin a walks programme and the format of it.
