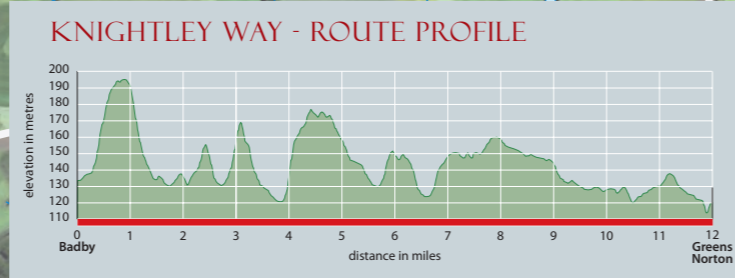
The **Walk, Eat & Drink** guides are available from South Northants Council and outlets across South Northamptonshire.

Walking Tips
 Warm up before setting off with a few stretches.
 Wear suitable footwear.
 Wear layers to keep a comfortable temperature.
 Carry a water bottle.



3 Worth walking in spring when Everdon Wood has its magnificent display of bluebells. 6 miles

4 Warning: take care crossing the golf course.

7 A very pretty walk with stunning views and interesting architecture. Good for young children. 4¾ miles

7 5¾ mile walk with wonderful views in all directions with a number of lakes and ponds to spot wildlife.

8 A walk of 5 miles across open farmland.

8 The southern terminus of the Knightley Way is in the centre of Greens Norton.

KNIGHTLEY WAY

This 12 mile route visits Foxley, Farthingstone and Fawsley Park to end in Greens Norton at the northern terminus of the Grafton Way. Much of the route passes through attractive countryside formerly owned by the Knightley family of Fawsley Hall. The northern terminus is by St Mary's Church in Badby (NN11 3AS) and the southern terminus by The Butchers Arms in Greens Norton (NN11 3AA). Full details are shown on OS Explorer Map 207 which we recommend you use in conjunction with this guide.

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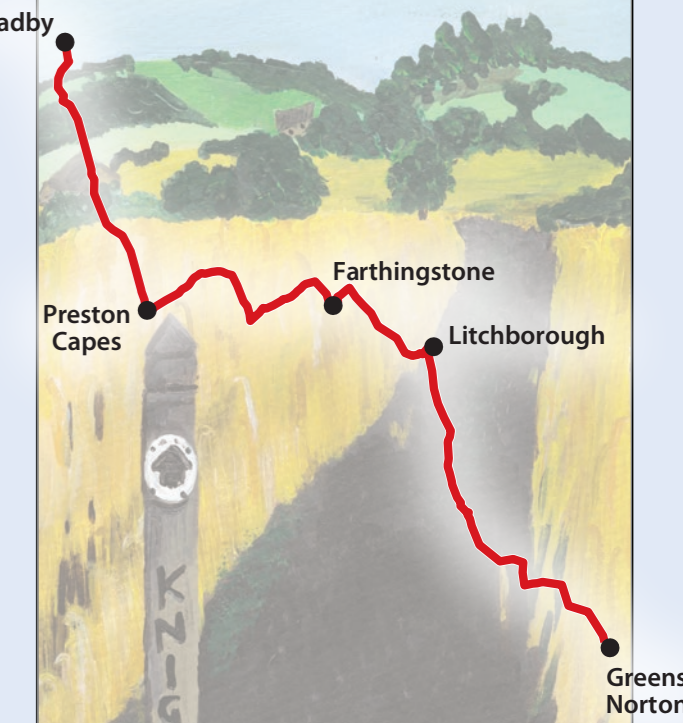
